2. Make a list of the most important people, places, events, and objects in the book.

3. Choose four of the most important and interesting items on your list. Draw and color an illustration of each one to create a "photo".

4. Write an interesting caption to describe each photo. Each caption should be at least three sentences. In the caption, explain why the image shown is important in the book.

5. Fold a sheet of construction paper in half, like a book. On the front, write a title for you album. Include the book title, author, and your name.

6. Open the album and glue the photos inside. Glue the corresponding caption beneath each photo.
